
As we sit down to write this, the weather is getting cooler, reports of snow falls have already trickled in and we are reminded that winter and skiing is right around the corner.



# Silver Ski Program Teaches Racing to Middle Schoolers

The Silver ski program is designed to help middle school age children transition into the world of Cross-Country ski racing. We make it a fun experience for them while they learn what it takes to train and race.

How old are the Silver Skiers? They are usually Middle school age, that is, between grades 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>. There are exceptions. If a fifth grader can ski well enough they are also welcome. They need to be able to ski for at least an hour with out stopping. That would usually translate into about 5k in the dark without Mom or Dad.

When do we meet? Our first meeting will be on a Sunday November 21st, then a week off for Thanksgiving. Before we get snow, we will meet once a week (probably on Sundays in December). Once there's snow, our regular meeting time will be on Wednesday and Thursday nights from 5:45 to 7:00. We will start on week

nights after the first of the year unless we get skiable snow sooner.


Where do we meet? When there is snow our regular meeting place will be Elver Park. We will also meet there for the dry-land training. If there is no snow after January we may go to Blackhawk Ski Club (membership required). Blackhawk has the capability to make snow. If we have a very thin layer of snow and the trails at Elver are not skiable we may seek out natural snow other places, i.e. Odana Golf Course, or on the ice of a local pond.

How much does it cost? The fee is only \$25 for the entire season. This fee also includes one of the coveted Silver Skier hats (one time only). If we go to Blackhawk during the season to ski on man-made snow a Blackhawk membership is REQUIRED. A single non-tow membership will be \$75 this year, or the whole family can join for \$140 (that's for an entire year). The facility can be used year-round for trail running, mountain biking, picnicking, etc

What races do we do? There is usually a "fist timer" race or two at Elver that are perfect for our beginners. Some of our skiers also race the 5k adult race on Tuesday nights. We will also go to the State High School Cross Country Ski Championships again this year where there is a Middle School division. This is a fun overnight weekend with 2 days of racing. We also strongly encourage participation in the Badger State Games. There are also races at Iola and Green Bay that are appropriate for us.

What about equipment? We have a rental program to help get you on skis. The fee is \$20 for a pair of skis for the season. We have both skating and diagonal skis; boots and poles are not included.

# **Renew Your Membership Online in Three Easy Steps**

Joining the Madison Nordic Ski Club or renewing your membership is easy and fun. What's more, by renewing or joining online you are assured that your membership will be recorded properly. At the time of this writing, online verification of memberships has only been available for a week and already two misspellings of last names and countless e-mail addresses have been corrected.

Here's how to renew your membership online.

## Step 1: Verify your e-mail address

While our tireless volunteers have done a great job over the years, keeping all of the e-mail addresses in our membership database up to date was never a priority. Since the renewal processes will use the e-mail address we have on file, you'll need to have yours updated before renewing. Just visit www.MadNorSki.org/cgi-bin/ verify.cgi. There you will enter your last name and the e-mail address you want to use when you renew your membership. If there's a perfect match, verify-dot-cgi will tell you when your membership expires and give you a link for renewing. If the match is lessthan-perfect, verify-dot-cgi will ask

you for your first name, street address, and phone number. This information is shuttled off to the webmaster who will look it over and may interact with you until everything is sorted out. Once that happens, you'll be able to renew online.

## Step 2 : Request Your Membership Renewal Link

Renew your membership online using your credit card. The club has a secure server specifically for this purpose. Just visit: www.MadNorSki.org/cgi-bin/ join.cgi. There you will see the current dues and various membership add-ons. At the bottom of the page is a button labeled, "Renew My Membership." Press it. That will cause an e-mail message to be sent which contains a renewal link. If you skipped step one and we don't have the correct e-mail address for you on file, you will be directed to verify-dot-cgi so that we can update your e-mail address.

## Step 3: Renew Your Membership Using Your Renewal Link


The successful completion of step 2 will result in you receiving an e-mail message with the link you need to renew. Just click the link or copy and paste it into a browser window. This will take you to the membership form and payment page. Fill in the blanks to renew and pay for your membership. When you do, payment will be verified and a receipt will be presented. A copy of this receipt will also be sent to you via e-mail. That's it—you did it!
