Sunday brought a more traditional classical race of 5 to 10 kilometers depending on the age class. Birken and Corrina continued to compete for JOQ points and Martin skied in the open class. We returned to Madison to face a week of 40 plus degrees, but in spite of the heat we still caught a fun night of skiing at Tyrol Basin on Tuesday night.
